

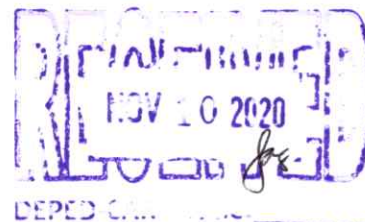

SUBJECT: Change of Schedule of the Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education to **November 23-24, 2020 every 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.** and the Pre-Conference Session with Children to **November 16, 2020 from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.**

DATE: November 6, 2020

This has reference to DM-LA-2020-0194 pertaining to the conduct of the **Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education**. This Office regrets to inform the above addressees that this Office had to move the schedule of the Summit because of the Senate budget hearing on November 13, 2020, which was originally scheduled to be the second day of the Summit.

In view of this development, the new schedule of the Summit is on **November 23-24, 2020 (Monday and Tuesday), from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.** (via Zoom and Facebook Live). This Office is happy to also inform the above addressees of the developments on the international participation in the Summit. Dr. Philipp Jaffé, a Member of the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child (UN CRC) and Director of the University of Geneva Child Rights Center, as well as Ambassador Evan P. Garcia, Philippine Permanent Mission of the Republic of the Philippines to the United Nations and Other International Organizations, have both confirmed their participation in the Summit through the delivery of a lecture on the rights of the child and message of support, respectively.

It may be recalled that in DM-LA-2020-0194, this Office requested a written message of about 120 to 150 words in support of the rights of the child, especially those rights in the context of education, for the Summit's digital Souvenir Program. Further, this Office also requested a video recording for the recitation of the *Panatang Makabata*. This Office extends its gratitude to the Regional Directors who have made their submission, but for those who have not yet submitted their message and recorded video recitation, the deadline for submission is extended to **November 13, 2020 (Friday)**. For sure, these messages and recordings will make the Summit more inspiring and motivating to those who continuously work for the education of children despite the COVID-19 pandemic.

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This has reference to the **Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education to be held on November 12-13, 2020, every 8:00 to 12:00 noon, via Zoom online platform.**

In the words of the Secretary, “learning must continue” in the time of the COVID-19 pandemic, and it has continued with the successful opening of classes. As children continue to be children during the COVID-19 pandemic, so must we continue upholding their rights during the pandemic. In line with this, we invite you to celebrate the National Children’s Month with us this November and give focus to the center of all that we do in DepEd – the learner.

You may recall that on the occasion of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) and the National Children’s Month last year, the DepEd held the **First National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education** on November 14-15, 2019 at the Manila Heritage Hotel. We are most grateful for your support for that maiden Summit, which made it more meaningful.

Undeterred by the COVID-19 pandemic, the DepEd will hold the **Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education**, albeit virtually, in line with the celebration of the National Children’s Month in the Philippines. Under Republic Act No. 10661, otherwise known as the “National Children’s Month Act,” the DepEd celebrates National Children’s Month every November to commemorate the adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) by the United Nations General Assembly on November 20, 1989, and “instill its significance in the Filipino consciousness.” As stated in DepEd Memorandum No. 68, s. 2020, the **Second**

**National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education**, is a highlight of the DepEd's celebration of this year's National Children's Month.

With the theme, *Isulong! Karapatan ng Bawat Bata sa Edukasyon sa Panahon ng COVID-19*, the Summit aims to reinforce the continuing commitment of the Philippine government, including the DepEd, and other stakeholders, in upholding children's rights, with focus on their rights in the context of education in normal times and during the COVID-19 pandemic. It also aims to build on the gains of the First National Summit held last year. The Second National Summit seeks to facilitate discussions and elicit recommendations on upholding rights-based education (RBE) in normal times and during the COVID-19 pandemic through a whole-of-DepEd, whole-of-government, and whole-of-society approach. It is also a venue to ensure the participation of children in shaping policies and actions pertaining to RBE in normal times and during the pandemic.

We hope to gather within the Summit's Zoom platform around 1,000 officials and personnel from the DepEd central office, field offices and public schools, as well as representatives from other national government agencies in the three branches of government, LGUs, private schools, civil society, international organizations, the business community, and the media. More importantly, children themselves and their parents, guardians, and caregivers will also participate. We will also stream the Summit live to thousands of viewers at the DepEd Philippines Facebook Page, similar to the child rights webinar series we conducted last September to October, which has garnered more than a million views.

We sincerely hope you will be able to join us in the upcoming Summit to signify solidarity and unity of the DepEd with the rest of the stakeholders of children's rights and RBE. We would also like to request a **short written message of about 120 to 150 words in support of the rights of the child, especially those rights in the context of education, for the Summit's digital Souvenir Program**. Further, if you have not been able to send a video recording of your recitation of the attached *Panatang Makabata*, we hope you can also send the recording to us, as requested in DM LA 2020-0142 dated September 9, 2020. The recording will be made part of the video montage of the DepEd officials, headed by the Secretary, reciting the *Panatang Makabata*, which will be shown during the Summit.

We would appreciate receiving your short written message in PDF and MS Word as well as the video recording of the *Panatang Makabata* on or before **Friday, November 6, 2020**. They will surely make the Summit more inspiring and motivating to those who continuously work for the education of Filipino children even during the COVID-19 pandemic.
