



## National Dancesport Championship 2022 Palarong Pambansa Limited Face to Face Competition

**Dancesport** is a game widely known as competitive ballroom dancing participated by a pair (boy and girl) on a dance floor with the objective of displaying technical quality, movement to music, partnering skills and choreography and presentation.

With the current situation, it is understood that physical distancing is necessary to maintain the safety of everyone. In this regard, the following are suggested modifications of the competition to adhere the IATF Guidelines.

**PRIORITY**: To protect the safety of our student athletes, coaches and officials at all times, before, during and after the competition.

## DANCESPORT COMPETITION GUIDELINES

## 1. <u>ELIGIBILITY</u>

- 1.1 Competitors must be enrolled in Junior High School and Senior High School until 18 years of age with in school year 2021-2022. The following suggestions can be considered in choosing the official entry of the region
  - **1.1.1** Regional Sports Manager may conduct their limited face to face competition depending on the availability of funds.
  - **1.1.2** Representatives from the 2019 Palarong Pambansa hcan be chosen for as long as their eligibility is qualified.
  - **1.1.3** If funds are not available, Regional Sports Manager may conduct elimination in their region. Participants who are willing to join the elimination may submit video of their entry per Division (1 for Latin and 1 for Standard). This will be judged virtually by the Professional Adjudicators from the Philippine Dancesport Federation. They will rank the competitors to choose their representative in the Palarong Pambansa. Video of the participant must consider the following:
    - 1.1.3.1 Use the music given by the Regional Sports Manager.
    - 1.1.3.2 Do not zoom in and out the video, using of camera stand is recommended.
    - 1.1.3.3 Cutting, enhancing and editing the video are not allowed.
    - 1.1.3.4 Video must be in landscape.
    - 1.1.3.5 Number of the competitors must be posted at the wall. Logo, Name of School nor athletes are not allowed.
- 1.2 Participants must be physically fit and fully vaccinated
- 1.3 Athletes must not have failing grades in each of any quarter for the current school year.
- 1.4 Must accomplish and submit the following:

- **1.4.1** Entry Form with complete details
- **1.4.2** Certificate of Enrollment
- 1.4.3 Parent Consent
- **1.4.4** SF-10 (Authenticated copy of Permanent Record for school year 2021-2022)
- **1.4.5** Medical Certificate signed by the Government Physician
- **1.4.6** Vaccination Card

**Note**: All required documents mentioned above will be sent through e-mail <u>palarongpambansadancesport@gmail.com</u> after registration.

**1.5** The host will have a special entry as a priviledge being the host of the event. There will be a total of 18 competing couples comprising 17 regions plus 1 entry from the host. The entry is composed of 1 couple for Latin and 1 couple for Standard and 2 coaches.

#### 6 <u>COMPETITION PROCEDURES, RULES AND REGULATIONS</u>

This competition will be held in accordance with the current World Dancesport Federation (WDSF) Rules and Regulations under the guidance of the Philippine Dancesport Federation (PDSF) as recognized by the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) and Philippine Olympics Committee (POC) to govern dancesport competitions in the Philippines.

In case of any disagreement in the language interpretation of the WDSF Rules and Regulations, the English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the Rules and Regulations shall be resolved as follows:

General Issues: To be resolved in accordance with the *Palarong Pambansa* Implementing Rules and Regulations.

Technical Issues: To be resolved in accordance with the WDSF Rules and Regulations and WDSF Norms.

#### 6.1 Competition Rules Dancesport

The regulations below cover the following disciplines:

- **6.1.1** Modern Standard Discipline with the following dances; Waltz, Tango, Viennese Waltz, Foxtrot, and Quickstep
- **6.1.2** Latin American Discipline with following dances; Samba, Chachacha, Rumba, Paso Doble and Jive
- **6.1.3** Limited face to face Competition is a competition with the composition of the limited number of participants and events which is strictly adhere to the recent IATF Rules.
- 6.1.4 The competition events in the New Normal is stated on Number 4.

#### 6.1.5 Description of the competition

This competition will be held in response to the continuity plan of the Palarong Pambansa during pandemic. Since the budget of Palarong Pambansa was affected by pandemic, this competition was offered to LGUs who can sponsor the needs of the competition and make the event successful. There will be 2 couple-representative per region (*1 couple for Latin and 1 Couple for Standard*). Limited number of participants were chosen to participate in this competition to adhere to the IATF rules and regulations and to ensure the safety of all persons involved.

# Note: 1 coach per couple will be allowed to accompany the competitors.

6.1.6 All Officiating Officials, Coaches and Competitors must strictly follow the Safety Health Protocols.

## 6.2 Choreography and Syllabus

- **6.2.1** The *Palarong Pambansa* 2022 is subjected to the following choreography:
  - 6.2.1.1 Junior Age Group / Secondary Level will have an <u>open</u> <u>syllabus/competitive routine</u>

## 6.3 Lifts

- **6.3.1** Lifts are NOT permitted in any category, level and dance;
- **6.3.2** A lift is any movement during which one member of a couple has both feet off the floor at the same time with the assistance of the partner;
- **6.3.3** The Chairman of the Board of Adjudicators will **DISQUALIFY** couples who will perform lifts during competition.

## 6.4 Marking

- **6.4.1** Since technology does not allow open marking system, closed marking shall be used in all rounds of the competition;
- **6.4.2** Either of the SKATING SYSTEM or ABSOLUTE JUDGING SYSTEM shall be used in the competition.
- **6.4.3** The use of technology-aided adjudication and automated scrutineering is highly encouraged but is subject to its availability/feasibility.

## 6.5 Selection of Heats, Quarter Finals, Semi-Finals and Finals

- 6.5.1 Competitions shall be composed of at least a 1<sup>st</sup> round, Quarter Final, Semi- Final and Final rounds;
- **6.5.2** 1<sup>st</sup> round will be composed of 17 couples; selection of heats shall be in random; Adjudicators will select 12 for the Semi-Finals.
- **6.5.3** Semi-Final round will be composed of 12 couples. Adjudicators will select 6 for the Finals.
- **6.5.4** The Final Round will be composed of six (6) couples; Adjudicators shall rank participating couples according to their performances with 1 being the highest mark. In no case shall same ranking be given to more than one couple;
- **6.5.5** The re-dance system shall apply from the 1<sup>st</sup> round to the final round.

## 6.6 Competition attire (Costuming)

Competitors shall dress according to the WDSF Dress Regulations. Each athlete may change costumes up to 3 times from the first round to the final round provided such costume has passed the screening of costumes and competition attires set by the Tournament Management;

(See enclosure A and B for detailed information of dancesport costuming.)

## 6.7 Dance Order

The sequence of dances shall be as follows:

## 6.7.1 BRACKET 3

LATIN AMERICAN DISCIPLINE – Samba, Chachacha, Rumba, Paso Doble, Jive MODERN STANDARD DISCIPLINE– Slow Waltz, Tango, Viennese Walt, Foxtrot, Quickstep

#### 6.8 Music

### 6.8.1 Time allowed and tempi.

In all rounds of the competition, the music shall be in a minimum of one minute and thirty seconds to a maximum of two minutes except for JIVE and QUICKSTEP which is one minute to a maximum of one minute and thirty seconds.

## 6.8.2 Type of Music

In this competition, the music must have the character of the dance performed. In Latin Dances for example, no disco music shall be played.

## 6.9 Disqualification Rules

The couples will be disqualified from the competition if proper dress regulations based on WDSF rules and guidelines are not followed. Also, the competitors/couple will be disqualified if they are not present in their event. **Lifts** are NOT permitted in any category level and dance refer to 6.3.

## 7 <u>HEALTH AND WELFARE OF ATHLETES/COACHES/ TRAINERS/</u> OFFICIATING OFFICIALS/ GENERAL PUBLIC

## 7.1 ATHLETES/ COMPETITORS

7.1.1 Covid antigen test is required.

7.1.2. There must a break of at least 20 minutes between the rounds of the competition;

7.1.3 All competitors must be fully vaccinated. Present the vaccination card. (The existing AITF Rules will apply)

7.1.4 Athletes who have colds, flu and cough are not permitted to play. Body temperature check is required.

7.1.5 Use of face mask is strictly required except during performance.

7.1.6 Athletes must strictly apply the Safety and Health Protocols

7.1.6 All final prize presentations shall be concluded before 21:00 (9:00 PM)

### 7.2 COACHES/ TRAINERS/ OFFICIATING OFFICIALS

7.2.1 Covid Saliva RT-PCR Test/ antigen test is required.

7.2.2 All Coaches/ Trainers/ Officiating Official must be fully vaccinated. Present the vaccination card. (The existing IATF Rules will

apply)

7.2.3 Athletes who have colds, flu and cough are not permitted to be in the venue of the competition. Body temperature check is required.

7.2.4 Use of face mask is strictly required at all times.

7.2.5 Coaches/ Trainers and Officiating Officials must strictly apply the Safety and Health Protocols

#### **7.3 GENERAL PUBLIC**

7.3.1. Personal or actual viewing are not allowed. Parents, teachers and others can see or watch the game via Facebook live and or other live streaming media only.

7.3.2 Only the medical team, police and DepEd organizer are allowed inside the gym, must fully vaccinated and a vax card is required to present.

7.3.3 Hand sanitation, body temperature check and use of footbath

sanitation is required before entering the playing venue.
