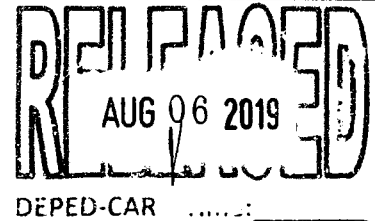

Subject: **8<sup>th</sup> NORTHEASTERN LUZON REGION SCOUT JAMBOREE**

1. We are pleased to announce the holding of the 8<sup>th</sup> Northeastern Region Scout Jamboree on 27-31 August 2019 at Tariuk Hills, Santiago City with the theme "Commitment to Excellence."

2. **Aims & Objectives.**

The jamboree aims to provide an environment of learning, safe and enjoyable activities to enhance their physical, social, mental, emotional and spiritual potentials. At the end of the jamboree the scouts would be able to:

- 2.a promote regional solidarity and understanding
- 2.b. undertake community service activities through the community immersion projects under the World Scout Environment Education Program (WSEEP); appreciation of nature through the Scouts-Go-Solar, and promotion of peace among their fellow scouts and their leaders and the community through the Messenger of Peace initiatives.
- 2.c undergo activities that will enable them to complete the selected merit badges requirements for both Boy Scout and Senior Scout advancement like Filipino Heritage, Handicrafts, Camping, Hiking and others.
- 2.d Develop skills and competencies through team buildings activities, games, vocational activities, group dynamics, creativity, character building and critical thinking through problem solving.
- 2.e acquire insights and share their actions/responsibilities in line with the Sustainable Development Goals.

3. **Qualification:**

3.a **Scout**

- registered Boy Scouts or Senior Scouts

- must be at least nine (9) years old to twelve (12) years for boy scouts & twelve (12) years old to seventeen (17) years old for Senior Scouts.
- must have adequate camping experiences and physically fit to undergo vigorous activities and must have parent's consent.

### 3.b **Adult Leaders**

- registered Unit Leader for at least two years and have adequate camping experience
- physically fit as certified by a physician and of good moral character

### 3.c **Regional Service Team**

The Regional Office in collaboration with the Council Scout Executives of the Northeastern Luzon Region will accept Regional Service Team, however interested applicants shall see their Council Scout Executives signifying their intention to serve as staff with the assigned modules to every council.

Modules are focused in Scout Skills, Team Games, Better World Programs, Cross Road of Cultures, Obstacles Challenge, Native Games and the Sustainable Development Goals and High Ropes. Global Development Village will also part of the jamboree

## 4. Registration Details

### 4.a **Registration Fee**

A registration fee of Five Hundred Pesos (Php 500.00) shall be charged each participant to defray administrative costs, program materials, souvenir items (bag, neckerchief, ID w/ lace, certificates) and other operating expenses.

### 4.b **Registration Guidelines**

In order to provide the host council, Santiago City Council the much needed logistical and administrative preparation, a reservation fee of One Hundred Pesos (Php 100.00) shall be deposited to the account of the Santiago City Council (Savings Account No. 1361223507) on or before 16 August 2019 which will serve as seed money for the jamboree. This also will determine the strength of the participation and to give ample time for the preparation of program materials, souvenir items and other administrative concern.

Should there be additional registration after the deadline of the payment of registration, they would be treated the least priority on all issuances of souvenirs but can attend the activities/modules of the jamboree.

### 4.c **Participation Ratio:**

In order to ensure that adult leaders accompany their scouts in their activities, we enjoin one adult leader in every four scouts. However,

scouts shall still prepare the meals with the guidance of their unit leaders. Special events staff will monitor this process.

## 5. Travel Itinerary


All council jamboree contingents must be settled in the camp not later than 1000hrs, 27 August 2019 and will only be allowed to leave the camp after the Grand Closing Ceremonies and issuance of Camp Clearance on 31 August 2019.

## 6. Food & other Jamboree Provisions


The Council Contingent shall make sure that the food provision and other basic requirements shall be adequate for the duration of the jamboree. Wet and dry markets will be available in the camp.




For light & water provisions, all council contingents shall bring their own water containers (big drums) and wires/extensions. Source or power will only be installed in strategic locations and perimeter areas.

7. All Council Scout Executives/Officers-In-Charge are enjoined to promote the jamboree to all districts/schools in their respective councils. They should also be responsible for the official release of their delegation from their respective division and personally request issuance of Council Memorandum to support the maximum participation of scouts to the event.
