



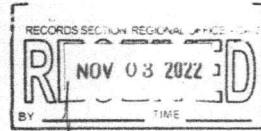

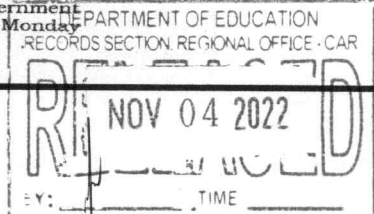
In response to the growing concern on the dismal reading performance of Filipino learners in both local and international large-scale assessments, the National Reading Program Technical Working Group and Bureau of Curriculum Development will hold a National Conference to evaluate and streamline all existing reading programs and subsequently create a national reading framework to guide the implementation of the National Reading Program. The event will be held on 07 to 11 November 2022 at Red Hotel in Cubao, Quezon City.

In order to achieve the goals of the National Reading Program, the Conference aims to:

- identify the different reading programs implemented across all governance levels;
• identify best practices and challenges in the implementation of reading programs;
• gather data on learners' reading proficiency;
• craft a framework for the NRP; and
• draft the implementing guidelines of the NRP.

All Regional and Division Reading Coordinators are invited to the said activity. In the absence of a Reading Coordinator, the Regional/Division Supervisor for Filipino or English shall take their place. The Regional Reading Coordinators/Regional Supervisors for Filipino or English are tasked to prepare an analysis and interpretation of the consolidated data gathered from their respective regions using the NRP Survey, disseminated through DepEd Memo No. DM-CI-2022-388 or The National Reading Program Survey. Attached is the activity matrix for your reference.

All expenses relative to the conduct of the activity including board and lodging, travel expenses shall be charged against FLO Funds subject to the usual government accounting and auditing procedures. First meal is lunch on 07 November, Monday while last meal is lunch on 11 November, Friday.

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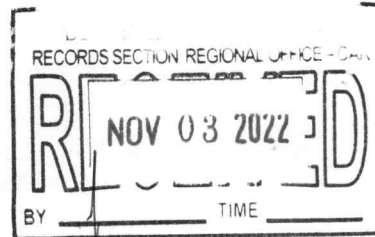
