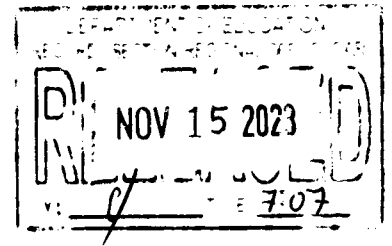

Relative to **DM-CT-2023-381** titled **2023 National Observance of Deaf Awareness Week**, this Office announces the celebration of this activity from November 10-16, 2023 with the theme, **“Promote Safe and Inclusive Education: Filipino Sign Language (FSL) and other means of Communication towards Resilient Future”**. 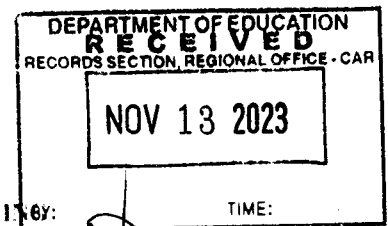


