

RFOT 2024 GENERAL GUIDELINES AND REMINDERS

I. CONDUCT OF SPECIFIC EVENTS

a. Specific events to be contested per category

- 1. Specific events to be contested per category shall be based on the national events.
- 2. Kindergarten StoryTelling and Tagis Talino are additional events to be contested at the regional level only.
- 3. The guidelines and mechanics of the events to be contested shall follow the 2024 National Festival of Talents guidelines. However, all materials, consumables, and tools needed for specific events shall be provided by participants.
- 4. Regional Focal is in-charge for the contest piece of the **Himig Bulilit** if the NFOT focal cannot provide 15 days (about 2 weeks) before May 1, 2024.
- 5. Judging for the Grand Dance Parade for Bayle is moving forward.

b. Selection of Learner Participants and Coaches

- 1. A learner-participant shall only be allowed to participate in one event.
- 2. The school head shall represent the coach during the conduct of the contest. However, during the national event, the teacher shall serve as the coach of the winner. PSDSs and Head Teachers may also serve as coaches for the RFOT. No teachers are allowed to be pulled out from classes to avoid disruptions to teaching and learning.

c. Results of the Contest

- 1. A rank system will be used to identify the top three winners except for SPED contests, which shall follow the point system as indicated in the 2024 NFOT Guidelines. Winners shall receive a certificate of recognition and a cash prize. Other participants shall receive a certificate of participation. Furthermore, the winning coaches will also receive a certificate of recognition, while others will receive a certificate of participation.
- 2. In cases of tie, time shall be considered to break the tie.
- 3. The result will be announced after all the coaches have acknowledged the results. Once announced, the results will be final and irrevocable.
- 4. Plaques will be awarded to overall winners during the closing program.

d. Cash Prize

Regional winners of the RFOT shall be awarded cash prizes funded by the Regional MOOE, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The top three winners shall claim the cash prize at the RTWG room after the declaration of results.

e. Members of Contest Technical Working Group (TWG)

Education Program Supervisors and Public School District Supervisors shall serve as members of the Contest Technical Working Group.

f. Judges

- 1. Outside judges shall be invited by the Regional EPS focal person per event.
- 2. The qualifications of the judge must be aligned with the skills to be judged.

II. BILLETING SCHOOLS

1. An ocular inspection of the contest venues and billeting schools will be scheduled two days prior to the conduct of the events. The Regional Office through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division shall coordinate with the focal persons and concerned school heads regarding the inspection.

3. Each delegation is required to bring their own cooking and eating paraphernalia. Participants shall be requested to bring their own bedding and toiletries, as well as hygiene kits. All coordinators of delegations shall ensure cleanliness and orderliness during their stay at the billeting schools.

III. CONDUCT OF OPENING PROGRAM, CLOSING PROGRAM, AND SOLIDARITY MEETING

a. Opening Program

The Opening Program will be held at Baguio City National High School (BCNHS) Auditorium on May 1, 2024 at 1:00 PM. Only coaches and officials, including select learners, are allowed to attend the program. A maximum of 50 participants is allotted per SDO. Each SDO is requested to bring their own SDO banner to be submitted to the Coordinator of BCNHS in the morning of May 1 for the Opening Program.

b. Closing Program

The Closing Program and Awarding of Overall Winners for RFOT will be held at BCNHS Auditorium on May 3, 2024/8:30 A.M. SDO Officials and first

place winners, along with their school heads are requested to participate in the said program.

c. Solidarity Meetings

- 1. A solidarity meeting shall be conducted per event after the opening program.
- 2. All the school heads who will represent the coach shall be required to attend the solidarity meeting.
- 3. All first-place winners and their school heads who served as coaches in the RFOT are requested to join the coordination meeting after the closing program on May 3, 2024 in preparation for the 2024 NFOT.

IV. ISSUANCE OF COMPENSATORY OVERTIME CREDIT (COC) AND SERVICE CREDIT

The Schools Division Offices (SDOs) are requested to take charge of the issuance of the Memorandum and other relevant documents for the release of COC/CTO for non-teaching personnel who served as members of technical working groups or coaches in the conduct of the 2024 RFOT pursuant to the guidelines specified in DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 (Updated Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits of Teachers) per CSC-DBM Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2004 (Non-Monetary Remuneration for Overtime Services) whichever is appropriate and applicable.

Likewise, the CLMD shall take charge of the issuance of the Memorandum and other relevant documents for the release of COC/CTO for the personnel of the Regional Office who served as members of the Regional Technical Working Group.

2024 NATIONAL FESTIVAL OF TALENTS

To: Undersecretaries Assistant Secretaries Bureau and Service Directors Regional Directors Minister, Basic, Higher and Technical Education, BARMM Schools Division Superintendents Public and Private School Heads

- In line with the goal of delivering quality, relevant, inclusive, and responsive basic education, the Department of Education (DepEd) Curriculum and Teaching (CT) Strand, through the Bureau of Learning Delivery (BLD), will conduct the 2024 National Festival of Talents (NFOT) with the theme, Galing, Talino, at Husay ng mga Batang Makabansa sa Diwa ng MATATAG na Adhika in Region VII (Central Visayas) on July 9-12, 2024 (exclusive of travel time).
- As provided in Republic Act (RA) No. 10533 titled An Act Enhancing the Philippine Basic Education System by Strengthening Its Curriculum and Increasing the Number of Years for Basic Education, Appropriating Funds Therefore and for Other Purposes and DepEd Order (DO) No. 021 s. 2019 titled Policy Guidelines on the K to 12 Basic Education Program, NFOT serves as a clear and proactive reinforcement of the teaching and learning process, reflecting the significant association between what the learners learned in school and what they actually performed and produced during this activity. Consistent with the Department's dedicated efforts to producing functionally literate and holistically developed Filipinos, all NFOT events are aligned with the essential learning competencies and standards of the K to 12 curriculum.
- DepEd is expected to help achieve the much-needed protection and preference of local creatives and products, with the passing of RA 11904, also known as the Philippine Creative Industries Development Act. For this reason, NFOT shall contribute toward the goal of enhancing learners' competence in creative industries.
- NFOT is a DepEd annual co-curricular activity that provides meaningful learning opportunities for basic education learners to display their talents and skills anchored on the learning competencies achieved in schools. It guides learners on which career path to take relevant to the four curriculum exits (higher education, middle-level skills development, entrepreneurship, and employment) of the Enhanced K to 12 Basic Education Program. Likewise, NFOT serves as a culminating activity of gauging learning mastery and skill development in accordance with learning standards.

- 5. NFOT supports the MATATAG agenda: **MA**ke the curriculum relevant to produce competent and job-ready, active, and responsible citizens; **TA**ke steps to accelerate delivery of basic education facilities and services; **TA**ke good care of learners by promoting learner well-being, inclusive education programs and ensuring that all learners, regardless of background, have access to quality learning opportunities and services; and **G**ive support to teachers to teach better.
- 6. Participants in NFOT are learners from public and private elementary and secondary schools who will showcase their talents and skills and explore the culture of the host region. Together with their respective teacher-coaches during NFOT, they shall listen to the invaluable insights to be shared by the invited panel of experts after their performance; thereby, strengthening the teaching and learning of target learning competencies.
- 7. Participation in the 2024 NFOT is **voluntary** and shall not, in any way, affect the time-on-task of teachers as this activity's target learning standards and competencies are already embedded in teachers' actual classroom teaching and assessment process.
- 8. Since this activity falls on the end-of-school year break (EOSY), five-day service credits shall be granted to all participating teacher-coaches in accordance with DO 53, s. 2003 titled Updated Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers.
- 9. To ensure the safety, health, and well-being of all NFOT participants and delegates, strict observance of minimum health protocols shall be implemented within all activity premises.
- 10. The official logo, delegation per region, general guidelines, and specific guidelines for each skills exhibition are contained in the following enclosures:

Enclosure No. 1: Official Logo of the NFOT;

Enclosure No. 2: Distribution of Official Delegates;

Enclosure No. 3: General Guidelines on the Conduct of the 2024 NFOT; and

Enclosure No. 4: Specific Guidelines on the Conduct of the 2024 NFOT

Events.

- 11. There shall be **no registration fee** for the 2024 NFOT. Traveling expenses of learner-participants and teacher-coaches and program support funds (PSF) for the conduct of the Regional and Division Festival of Talents shall be charged to the **2024 Basic Education Curriculum (BEC) Funds** and shall be downloaded to the regions while traveling expenses of other official delegates and those from the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) shall be charged to **their local funds** or **other eligible fund sources**, subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 12. The host region and division shall provide meals to participants in their billeting schools, including kits, identification tags, contest materials, and other eligible supplies and materials necessary for the conduct of the different events of the 2024 NFOT in accordance with the budget allocation. The first meal to be served shall be **dinner on July 8, 2024** while the last meal shall be **afternoon snacks on July 12, 2024**.
- 13. All designated heads of the regional delegations are advised to coordinate closely with the host region and division regarding the details of their arrival and

departure from the venue and ensure proper administrative arrangements with the concerned committees.

GENERAL GUIDELINES ON THE CONDUCT OF 2024 NATIONAL FESTIVAL OF TALENTS (NFOT)

- 1. The 2024 NFOT with the theme, **Galing, Talino, at Husay ng mga Batang Makabansa sa Diwa ng MATATAG na Adhika** shall be held in Region VII (Central Visayas) from July 9 to 12, 2024 (exclusive of travel time).
- 2. For the guidance of all participants, the general guidelines of the 2024 NFOT are listed as follows:
 - A. All events of the 2024 NFOT shall be conducted under the competition category.
 - B. Participants of the 2024 NFOT are Filipino learners in basic education who are expected to showcase their best products, services, and performances in different event categories as authentic pieces of evidence of their learning across academic areas, key stages, inclusion, and special curricular programs. They shall be accompanied by their respective teacher-coaches.
 - C. Learner-participants shall secure their parent/guardian's consent for participation in the 2024 NFOT.
 - D. Participation is open to learners in basic education who are:
 - currently enrolled in public or private elementary and secondary schools for SY 2023-2024; and
 - currently enrolled in other inclusion programs such as Alternative Learning System (ALS), Indigenous Peoples Education (IPEd), Special Needs Education (SNEd), and Madrasah Education Program (MEP) for SY 2023-2024.
 - E. Learner-participants and teacher-coaches shall receive a Certificate of Recognition and Participation from the Bureau of Learning Delivery Student Inclusion Division (BLD-SID). They shall also receive a Certificate of Appearance from the host region/division.
 - F. Each learner-participant is allowed to participate in only one (1) event category during the 2024 NFOT.
 - G. All regional focal persons of the 2024 NFOT are advised to submit the printed list of official participants of the different event categories to be endorsed by their Regional Director to the Office of the Director IV, Bureau of Learning Delivery (Attention: Student Inclusion Division), 4th Floor, Bonifacio Building, DepEd Complex, Meralco Avenue, Pasig City not later than June 17, 2024. The Excel file with the format: (first name, middle initial, and last name) of the said list should be sent through email at nfot.bldsid@deped.gov.ph.

H. Should the School Heads, Chiefs of the Curriculum Implementation Division (CID), Assistant Schools Division Superintendents, and Schools Division Superintendents, with official participants wish to attend the 2024 NFOT, their attendance shall be regarded as Official Business. However, they shall be responsible for making arrangements for their travel, meals, and board and lodging for the whole duration of their stay in Region VII.

3. Entries at the National Level

- A. Only one (1) entry per event category per region shall be accepted at the national level;
- B. To ensure the objective selection of prospective learner-participants who will compete at the national level, all regional offices are advised to conduct their local festival of talents (school-based to division to region). The schedules are as follows:
 - School and Division Levels earlier than May 17, 2024
 - Regional Level not later than May 24, 2024
- C. The regional offices may refer to the specific guidelines set for each event category to select their learner participants who will join the 2024 NFOT.
- D. The skills exhibition of the different events shall be conducted at the school level based on standards to ensure the participation of all learners and the quality of participants who will take part in the screening process at the division and regional levels.

4. National Level Awards

- A. All entries shall be ranked from highest to lowest. However, only the top 5 entries shall be given corresponding points in determining the overall champion.
- B. Only the top three (3) national winners of each event in the different skills competition shall be declared.
- C. The top three (3) winners per event shall receive a national certificate of recognition and a medal.
- D. The teacher-coaches of the top 3 winners shall also receive a national certificate of recognition.

- F. The top five (5) performing regions shall be awarded with trophies/plaque of recognition.
- G. Special awards (to be determined) shall be awarded to qualified regions during the awarding ceremonies.
- H. Should there be ties in the top 5 performing regions, the region with higher number of gold medals will prevail.

5. Mechanics for Judging

- A. The services, products, and performances of participants to be showcased in all events shall be judged by three (3) members of the panel of experts.
- B. The scores of the three (3) members of the panel of experts in any event shall be computed to determine the AVERAGE SCORE of each participant/team. The average score shall be the basis for ranking the participants to determine the top three (3) winners.
- C. The tabulation, consolidation, and review of all results shall be done by a committee composed of select Bureau Specialists and a chair of the panel of experts.
- D. The final results shall be reviewed by the members of the panel of experts before they affix their signatures on the summary sheet.
- E. In case of a tie, triple tie, or quadruple tie, the participant who finished with the shortest/earliest time will be declared as the "winner". In the event of another tie, the panel of experts will decide.
- F. The decision of the panel of experts is final and irrevocable.

6. General Orientation

A. A general orientation to be attended by the Regional Focal Persons of the 2024 NFOT, as well as the Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD) Chiefs shall be conducted on **Day 0** at a venue to be announced during the registration. All clarifications, issues, and concerns relative to the 2024 NFOT shall be addressed during the orientation. Any concerns

- raised during the actual conduct of the events shall not be entertained unless valid and necessary;
- B. All teacher-coaches of each event shall have a separate orientation with their Regional Focal Person regarding the specific guidelines and mechanics of the events a day before their actual conduct. The distribution of supplies and materials needed for the specific events shall be done at the venues. Hence, learner-participants are required to be at the venue at least two (2) hours before the start of the event.

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- A. The quiz is open to all types of learners who are officially enrolled in grades 4-6
- B. There shall be one learner-contestants who comes from either Grades 4-6.
- C. Test questions shall be based on Araling Panlipunan Grades 4-6 competencies. The official list of references shall be released by the



Bureau of Curriculum Development (BCD) through the Bureau of Learning Delivery (BLD).

- D. During the quiz, learner-contestants shall be provided with white board, markers and erasers.
- E. Filipino shall be used as the official language in the conduct of the quiz.
- F. Learner-contestants shall be given a total number of twenty one (21) questions, of which eight (8) are "easy," seven (7) are "average," and six (6) are "difficult."
- G. Points for every correct answer shall be given as follows: One (1) point for "easy" question, Two (2) points for "average" question, and Three (3) points for "difficult" question. In case of tie, a clincher question drawn from the "difficult" category shall be asked until a winning pair emerges.
- H. Learner-contestants shall be given ten (10) seconds for easy, twelve (12) seconds for average, and fifteen (15) seconds for difficult round to answer the question.
- I. The quizmaster shall read each question twice. Countdown shall start after the question has been read the second time and the quizmaster says "GO". When the quizmaster says "STOP "or "TIME IS UP", contestants must raise their answers to the audience and to the Board of Judges until such time that the proctors have verified or confirmed the answer. Those who are unable to observe the instruction shall not earn a point. The Chair of the Board of Judges will decide whether or not the instruction is observed.

- A. The **Foreign Language Exposition (FLE)** event is open to all Key Stage 3 (Grades 7 to 10) learner-participants who are officially enrolled in public and private schools offering Special Program in Foreign Language (SPFL). This shall be done under **contest category**. Each region shall register one (1) participant (learner) and one (1) teacher-coach per foreign language.
- B. Foreign languages included in the FLE are (1) Spanish, (2) Mandarin, (3) Nihongo, and (4) Korean. This shall be participated by the implementing regions.
- C. The regional SPFL coordinator shall upload the picture to be portrayed and the description of the character to the designated Google Form. The National Technical Working Group (NTWG) shall print it to serve as reference.
- D. Participants shall wear the costume of the famous character relevant to their foreign language (Spanish, Mandarin, Nihongo, or Korean's film, politics, history, literature, culture, and religion). Only accessories as part of the costume are allowed.
- E. Teacher-coaches may assist their participants and provide their snacks (30) minutes prior to the start of the event.
- F. Drawing of lots by participants for their number identifier shall be done thirty (30) minutes before the event proper.
- G. Before the start of the event, participants shall parade before the audience.



- H. The NTWG shall provide participants with materials (pen, paper, and contest picture).
- I. Participants shall be given three (3) minutes to study a picture (e.g. about oneself and others, family and home, friends, school, and community). After three (3) minutes, the aforesaid materials shall be collected from participants.
- J. Participants shall deliver a two-minute introduction of a famous character that they portray, culminating in a speech describing the given picture in a minimum of two minutes and a maximum of three minutes.
- K. Participants are expected to use foreign language in a casual or conversational manner.
- L. Colored flags shall be raised by the NTWG to cue the participants during the contest proper. Green flag shall be raised to inform the participants on the 'start of their allotted time,' yellow flag to signal the remaining '30 seconds,' and red flag to signal that their 'time is up.' When the red flag is raised, the participants are expected to stop their speech delivery.
- M. Using cellphone or any gadget and/or bringing reference materials/handouts, props, musical instrument/accompaniment are not allowed inside the holding area and contest venue.

GENERAL GUIDELINES 2024 NATIONAL MUSABAQAH



(A Showcase of Talents and Skills in Arabic Language and Islamic Values)

- 1. The Musabaqah is open to all learners in the public schools who are enrolled and tagged in LIS as ALIVE learners.
- 2. Learner-participants should have registered and complied with the following requirements prior to the activity:
 - a. Certification as Winner/Regional Memorandum;
 - b. Parents' Consent;
 - c. PSA-annotated Birth Certificate;
 - d. Accomplished Entry Form;
 - e. School Form 10 (for Verification);
 - f. Medical Certificate, and:
 - g. School ID
- 3. Any learner-participant who fails to comply with the requirements and the qualifications specific to each category shall be disqualified.
- 4. Filled out entry form should be submitted at least two weeks before the conduct of the activity. (possible goggle form)
- 5. The learner-participants shall be given a control number to conceal the region they represent.
- 6. Winners in each category shall receive medals. All participants shall receive a certificate of participation.
- 7. Winning coaches shall receive certificate of recognition while non-winning coaches will be given a certificate of participation.
- 8. The top 3 regions shall be awarded with a plaque of recognition.
- 9. Only official coaches can file an appeal to the Grievance Committee, should there be contest.
- 10. The whole proceedings shall be recorded by the NTWG.
- 11. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- A. There shall be one (1) learner-participant, Grade 5, male or female, ages ten to eleven (10-11).
- B. The learner-participant shall be given five to seven (5-7) minutes including preparations.
- C. At the first bell, the learner-participant shall get ready. At the second bell, the learner-participant shall start the "Muqaddimah" (Introduction). At the third bell, the learner-participant may stop as he/she already consumed the minimum number of minutes or continue until the fourth bell for the maximum number of minutes. The learner-participant whose speech is shorter than the minimum requirement of five (5) minutes as well as those who exceeded the maximum of seven (7) minutes will get a deduction of one (1) point from his/her total score for every minute or a fraction thereof in excess/deficit of the allotted time.
- D. The learner-participant may choose English or Filipino as a medium of delivery.
- E. "Adillah" (evidences) from the Qur'an and Hadith should be recited in the Arabic Language.
- F. The printed copy of the entry shall be submitted to the NTWG Secretariat during the Solidarity Meeting, a day before the competition.
- G. The oration (naseehah) shall not, in whole or in part, expressly or impliedly, subvert the principles of democracy, offend any religion, sect, or creed, or violate either the standards of decency or the laws on libel and oral defamation.
- H. For hygienic and observance of health safety protocols, each participant will bring their own lapel microphone/clip-on microphone

- A. There shall be one (1) learner-participant per region, Grade 2, male or female, ages seven to eight (7-8).
- B. During the contest proper, the learner-participants shall be seated at the designated holding area. They should not see the process undergone by the contestant on stage.
- C. The learner-participants take turns on stage to identify the letters engraved/cut on illustration board within one (1) minute. The facilitator mixes the 28 letters as they take their turns.
- D. There shall be one (1) timekeeper/buzzer, one (1) recorder, one (1) tabulator and a panel of judges.
- E. Timekeeper shall signal the start and the end of time allotted for each learner participant.
- F. Panel of judges shall confirm the number of the correctly identified Arabic letters.
- G. The recorder tallies the scores.
- H. The corresponding time of each participant shall be flashed on the screen.
- The three learner-participants with the highest number of correctly identified Arabic letters in a shortest recorded time shall be declared as the winner. There shall be first,



second and third winners. In case of tie, another three (3) letters shall be added to twenty-eight (28) letters for the clincher round to be given by the board of judges to determine in the place/rank from which they tied. One point shall be given for every correct response.

J. The whole proceedings shall be recorded by the NTWG.

- A. Each region shall have one (1) participant (Deaf) for Filipino Sign Language and one (1) participant (Blind) for Braille Reading.
 - *The participant with the highest score shall automatically represent the region in the NFOT. In case of tie, the RTWG shall decide on this matter.
- B. Story to be interpreted shall be provided by the NTWG of the said event aligned with the 2024 NFOT theme.
 - *The contest piece shall be given to the contestants in the actual event.

 *Each contestant shall be given a 10-minute preparation prior to the actual contest performance.
 - *Order of performance shall be identified through draw lots with the coaches.
- C. The showcase is open from Grades 7 to 10 Deaf and blind learners who are officially enrolled.
- D. Each region is given 7-minute presentation/showcase.
- E. The following sequence shall be strictly observed:
 - Presentation of participant information (Name of Learner, Grade Level, School, Division, and Region);
 - Reading proper (story shall be projected in a wide screen (Deaf) and braille copy of the story (Blind) shall be distributed to the participants in holding area prior to the actual performance.



• At the end of the performance, moral lesson of the story should be emphasized.

F. Only participants shall be allowed in the designated holding area one hour before the event.

G. There will be three (3) judges for Storytelling in Filipino Sign Language (FSL) and three (3) judges for Storytelling in Braille Reading.

H. Judging of winners shall be based on DO 36, 2016 (Awards and Recognition). The following awards shall be given:

EVENT RULES AND MECHANICS

General Guidelines

- 1. The competition shall consist of proposal writing and One-Minute Presentation. The teams shall develop and present their proposal to the panel of judges of their solution about a real-world problem/scenario of local or global importance. The situation containing the problem shall be given on-site during the showcase.
- 2. The participants are given 3 hours to conceptualize and prepare their written description of the proposed solution for the oral presentation. All entries submitted shall not bear any markings that identify their regions. The participants may use the internet and other printed resources in developing their written solution, however, the teams are not allowed to confer with their coaches while the activity is on going. Any form of communication between the participants and other parties (coach, parents, classmates, teachers, etc.) shall warrant automatic disqualification.
- 3. The proposed solution shall have the following components:

Summary (100 - 200 Words)

Background and Problem (200 - 300 Words)

(Describe the challenges and how the proposed solution addresses the problem presented. Scientific Principles and Technology applicable to the resolution of the problem.)

Beneficiaries

Proposed Solution to the Problem Presented (300 – 500 words)

Methods/Details of the proposed solution including the Cost - Analysis as applicable.

Include illustrations, figures, and charts.

References: May use any format as long as consistency is observed

- 4. The teams shall encode their proposals in word processing software, double-spaced using Bookman Old style font size eleven set in A4 size paper. Margins shall be 1 inch on all sides of the paper. Within the 3 hours, the teams shall submit their outputs (electronic copy) to the facilitators.
- 5. The proposals shall be subjected to a plagiarism check. Any proposals which exceed 15% similarity index (uncited) shall be



deducted 2 points from the total score for every percent in excess. However, cited references shall be excluded from the 15% tolerance.

6. The submitted proposals shall be evaluated by the assessors before the oral presentation.

7. A timer board shall be shown to the public as well as to the participants.

8. At the end of one minute, a buzzer shall signal that the time for presentation is up and the participants shall immediately stop presenting.

9. After the presentation, the assessors will ask questions for clarifications.

10. The participants will be ranked based on the combined scores in the written and the oral presentation where the highest scorer will be ranked first and so on.

11. In addition to recognize exemplary performance of learner-participants, recognition merit system shall be implemented as follows:

I. Event Rules and Mechanics

- 1. Certificate of Enrollment signed by the School Head shall be submitted to the Technical Working Group before the contest event.
- 2. All participants shall wear their School ID.
- 3. Coaches are not allowed to enter the contest room.
- 4. There shall be two (2) participants per SDO, 1 pax per stage.
- 5. The officials for this category are the quizmaster, proctor, timekeeper, and recorder.
- 6. The sealed envelope that contains the questions shall be opened by the quizmaster during the contest proper.
- 7. Questions are all written in Filipino.
- 8. There shall be three (3) rounds of questions namely easy, average, and difficult. The easy round shall have five (5) questions at one (1) point each. The average round shall have five (5) questions at two (2) points each. The difficult round shall have five (5) questions at three (3) points each.

- 9. Each question shall be read twice by the quizmaster. After the second reading, the quizmaster shall say "Go". The timer starts when the quizmaster gives the GO signal. The contestants then shall write their answers in the meta-strips within ten (10) seconds for easy and average rounds and twelve (12) seconds for the difficult & clincher rounds.
- 10. The learner-contestants are allowed to change their answer within the allotted time.
- 11. When the time is up, the timekeeper rings the bell/buzzer. The contestants then shall stop writing and show their answer to the proctor by raising their meta-strips.
- 12. The proctor shall check the answer of each contestant and the recorder will project on the screen and write on the tally sheet.
- 13. In case of appeal, only the official contestants may raise a complaint or clarification. This shall be done immediately after the item before the next question is read.
- 14. Queries and clarification done after the entire contest shall NOT be entertained.
- 15. After each round, points shall be tabulated. The final scores shall be tabulated after the difficult and/or clincher rounds shall be posted on the screen.
- 16. The contestants with the highest points win. They shall be declared as first, second, and third place winners respectively.
- 17. In case of a tie, a clincher round shall be given. The first one to give the correct answer shall be the winner. If no contestant can answer correctly, another clincher question shall be given until there is a winner.
- 18. The decision of the Judges/Technical Working Group is final.
- 19. The whole process shall be recorded.
