



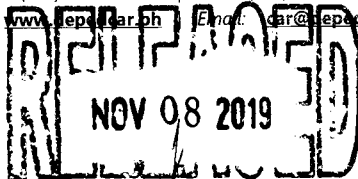

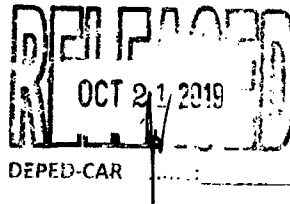

1. The DepEd-CAR through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division, in coordination with the Math and Science Teachers Organizations will conduct the 2019 Regional Mathematics and Science Festival on November 25-29, 2019 at Tabuk City with the Theme: *"Science and Technology, and Mathematics for the people: Enabling Technologies for Sustainable Development"*.
2. This annual academic competition aims to promote Mathematics and Science & Technology consciousness among the youth and identify the most creative/innovative and the best Science and Technology researchers who will represent the region to the National Science and Technology Fair.



7. Supplies and materials for certificates and photocopying expenses shall be charged to the regional office funds.
8. Expected arrival of Division delegates is on November 25, 2019 at 1:00 P.M. onwards while those that are coming from the Regional office are on November 23, 2019. A coordination meeting of the Management and Working Committees will be held at Tabuk City National High School at 5:00 PM of November 25, 2019.
9. All delegates must wear their uniform with the prescribed color as agreed upon during the coordination meeting. The colors used during the CARAA meet will be followed.

1. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1, Rule IX of Republic Act 7079, also known as *Campus Journalism Act of 1991*, the Department of Education – Cordillera Administrative Region (DepEd – CAR) announces the conduct of the 2019 Regional Schools Press Conference with the theme, "**Empowering Communities through Campus Journalism**", to be held on the following dates and venue:

2. The conference aims to:
- Demonstrate understanding of the importance of journalism by expressing it through varied journalistic endeavors and approaches;
 - Sustain advocacy on social consciousness;
 - Provide a venue for enriching learning experience for students interested in pursuing journalism as a career;
 - Promote responsible journalism and fair and ethical use of social media; and
 - Enhance journalistic competence through healthy and friendly competitions.

3. The conference activities shall include the following in two (2) levels: elementary and secondary, and of two

- a. **Individual Contests –Elementary (English & Filipino); Secondary (English & Filipino)**
 - a.1 News Writing
 - a.2 Features Writing
 - a.3 Editorial Writing
 - a.4 Sports Writing
 - a.5 Copy Reading & Headline Writing

 - a.7 Photojournalism
 - a.8 Editorial Cartooning
 - a.9 Column Writing (Exhibition Only)
- b. **Group Contests- Elementary (English & Filipino); Secondary (English & Filipino)**
 - b.1 Radio Script Writing & Broadcasting
 - b.2 Collaborative Desktop Publishing (CDP)
 - b.3 Online Publishing-(Secondary only-English & Filipino)
 - b.4 TV Script Writing & Broadcasting-(Secondary only- English & Filipino)
- c. **School Paper contests- Elementary (English & Filipino); Secondary (English & Filipino)**
 - c.1 News Section
 - c.2 Features Section
 - c.3 Editorial Section
 - c.4 Sports section
 - c.5 Science & Technology Section
 - c.6 Layout & Page Design
- d. **Concurrent Sessions**
- e. **Awarding of Winners and Outstanding School Paper Advisers (SPAs) and Campus Journalists (CJs), among others.**

4. The main participants to this conference are the Top 5 Division Winners and Coaches in each of the eight (8) categories of the Individual Writing Contests, and Top 1 team winners and coaches of the Group Contests in the two levels and of the two media.

5. The members of the TWG for School Paper Contests are requested to be at the venue on November 24 with dinner as the first meal and last meal will be PM snack of November 26, 2019. Meals of the TWG and judges of the School Paper Contests from November 24-26, 2019 including the accommodation of judges for three nights shall be charged to the downloaded journalism funds while dinner of November 26 and other meals onward until breakfast of November 29, 2019 shall be charged to the registration subject to the usual accounting and auditing policies/rules and regulations.



6. A registration fee of Five Hundred Fifty Pesos (₱550.00) shall be collected from each participant to be paid in cash to the host division, charged against local funds/journalism funds or any available funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing policies/rules and regulations. This will cover honoraria and transportation of judges for the School Paper Contests, Individual and Group Contests, trophies, medals, certificates, kits, supplies, t-shirts and other operational expenses. Board and lodging of judges, meals of technical working groups and facilitators for the Individual and Group Contests from the region and host division shall be charged from the registration while meals of the participants shall be taken care of by their own division.

7. The host division shall be responsible on the purchase of supplies and materials needed during the contest proper, transportation allowance of the technical working group/judges, water supply and electric current used in the billeting schools etc. The division shall also be responsible in the liquidation of collected registration fee from the eight (8) divisions and submit their liquidation report to the Regional Office three (3) weeks after the conduct of the activity.

8. The School Paper Advisers and Campus Journalists are advised to pay their membership in the amount of sixty pesos (₱60.00) and thirty pesos (₱30.00) respectively to the Division Treasurers of their respective associations and to be submitted to the treasurer of the Regional Elementary and Secondary School Paper

Advisers Association (RESSPAA).

9. Election of the new set of RESSPAA Officers for both Elementary and Secondary shall be on November 27, 2019, 6:00 PM at Rizal, Kalinga. All School Paper Advisers are required to attend the said activity.
10. Members of the Regional Technical Working Group (RTWG) and Proctors are listed in Enclosure No. 1 and Enclosure No. 2 respectively.
11. Transportation and other incidental expenses of the participants shall be charged against local and other available funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
12. A two (2) day compensatory overtime credit or compensatory time-offs (COCs/CTO) shall be granted to the Technical Working Group (TWG) composed of teaching and non-teaching personnel in lieu for November 23 & 24, 2019 (Saturday and Sunday).

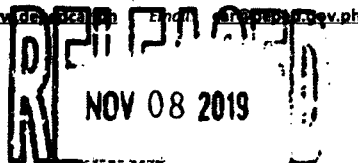
