

REGIONAL MEMORANDUM No. 537, 2025

SUBMISSION OF LIST OF POTENTIAL ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS FOR THE EXPANSION OF THE TECH-ENHANCED LEARNING PROJECT (CLASSIN CONNECT)

To: Assistant Regional Director Schools Division Superintendents All Schools Division Offices All Others Concerned

- In line with the proposed expansion of the Tech-Enhanced Learning Project (ClassIN Connect) in the Department of Education - Cordillera Administrative Region (DepEd - CAR) for School Year 2025 - 2026, this Office, through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD), hereby requests each Schools Division Office (SDO) to submit a list of potential elementary schools to participate in the project. The selection of schools should adhere to the following qualifications:
 - a. The school must have functional tablets and stable internet connectivity on the premises. For the target learners, stable internet connectivity at home is required to accommodate home-based classes, if necessary.
 - b. The school must demonstrate a high need for learning interventions among Key Stage 1 learners in Literacy, Numeracy, and Science. This should be supported by evidence from various assessment results such as the Functional Literacy Assessment Tool (FLAT) and the Comprehensive Rapid Literacy Assessment (CRLA), Rapid Mathematics Assessment (RMA) and any available Science assessment.
 - c. Learners must be willing and able to attend classes on Saturdays as part of the program schedule, with the approval of their parents.
 - d. Teachers must be willing and able to assist learners in utilizing tablets effectively for distance learning activities.
 - e. The school must have a supportive school head who is committed to overseeing and facilitating the successful implementation of the Tech-Enhanced Learning Project within the school.
 - f. Compliance with DepEd policies on data privacy and learner welfare to ensure that all learning activities are conducted securely and ethically.
- Each Schools Division Office (SDO) is encouraged to submit a maximum of two potential elementary schools with learners requiring interventions in Literacy, Numeracy, and Science. The template below must be duly accomplished and recommended by the Schools Division Superintendent. The completed submissions


